HELD FOR COLLATERAL PURPOSES

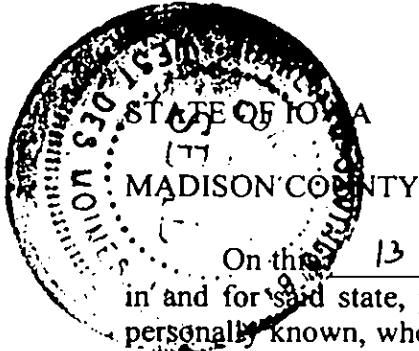
