

Co Engr's previous and current records do not indicate that corner is monumented. Supplemental History — Upon talking to with the Asst. Co. Engr., he indicated that this road was ariginally a state highway and they didn't have any road plans in their files. Once the road was under County jurisdiction, the road was regraded in 1968 and the corner tied out as indicated above. In the 1980's, the road was white-topped and no record of the corner position was preserved. In 2005, the road was paved with PCC paving. At that time, no monuments could be located representing the corner. Therefore, the existing road centerline was surveyed and road PI's colculated to match the 1968 survey data as much as possible. After construction, said Pl's were monumented with cut 'X's. 'Comer Recovery = Visually searched area and found cut 'X's.

and 2.0'± W of fence N. Monument found is clearly Co Engr's road Pl. However, PCC road makes excavation impractical, distance from this monument to SW Cor is within reason of record (see plat filed with this corner cert for measurements). addition, the corner was used as a road Pl for pavement construction in 1968, which would have determined the pavement location prior to 2005. Therefore, the road Pl location as determined in 2005 should be within reason of corner location. In Due to the above reasons, used cut 'X' as the correct corner. All ties are plumb distance unless indicated otherwise.

W/2 Cor. - History of Comer = No available records indicate that corner is monumented. Comer Recovery = Visually searched area and found wooden corner post for fence W beside wooden corner post for fence N-S. Searched area $2.0^{\circ}\pm E-W$ from $1.5^{\circ}\pm N$ of soid posts to $4.0^{\circ}\pm S$ of said posts with tile probe and found nothing. Since there is no record of monumentation at this corner and since no monument can be located, set 3/4" ø x 4.0' Alum capped from rerod (#15745) stamped "¼ COR", "7" and "12" between said corner posts using available fenceline evidence and used it as the correct corner. Rerod is 0.5' exposed in-line with fence W and 0.6'± W of fence N-S. All ties are plumb distance unless indicated otherwise
