SATISFACTION OF MORTGAGE



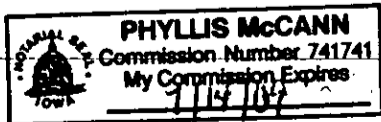
