Lot Five (5) in Block Two (2) of the town of Patterson, Madison County, Iowa,

The Easement shall be 32 feet in width, the centerline of which shall be the water pipeline and the necessary appurtenances thereto.

The grant and other provisions of this easement shall constitute a covenant running with the land for the benefit of the GRANTEE, its successors and assigns.
