INTER-DISTRICT AGREEMENT FOR
WARREN COUNTY-WINTERSET VOCATIONAL EDUCATION CONSORTIUM

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 28E and Section 280.15 of the Code of Iowa, this agreement is entered into between the Norwalk Community School District and the Winterset Community School District.

In consideration of the mutual obligations expressed below, the parties agree as follows:

1. The Norwalk Community School agrees to serve as the Sole Fiscal Agent for the Warren County-Winterset Vocational Education Consortium under the guidelines of the Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Applied Technology Education Act Amendments of 1990. P.L. 101-392 of which the Carlisle, Indianola, Interstate 35, Martensdale-St. Marys, Norwalk, Southeast Warren, and Winterset School Districts are a part of the WCW consortium. All districts will delegate representatives to function as a board with full voting rights and responsibilities for the improvement of vocational education through the pooling of resources for all of the consortium schools and their students.
2. The Norwalk Community School will report to the Department of Education as required by law and will not be responsible for any information supplied by the consorting schools that is falsified or inaccurate. The director will function to coordinate activities, facilitate, evaluate, and help insure that all populations are best served through consortium efforts as directed by the consortium board.
3. The consortium shall be responsible for the implementation of the Carl D. Perkins Act (p.L. 101-392) for origination, determination of needs, to help schools sequence classes, design competency based classes, integrate academics, articulate with other programs, and design classes that lead to employment.
4. The Norwalk Community School will be responsible for the inventory control system for all property purchased by the WCW Consortium. Placement of property in districts will be according to assessed need, with districts annually reporting inventory records and condition of property. Disposal of property will be according to state guidelines with any and all revenue reverting to the WCW consortium for use in other areas of need.
5. The Norwalk Community School will be responsible for the distribution of funds to all persons hired for the purpose of inservice, staff development, upgrading of curriculum and other approved expenditures as defined in the consortium application and approved by the consortium board.
6. The WCW consortium will direct finances through the fiscal agent (Norwalk Community School) as the sole agent for distribution of funds as defined in the WCW application for the approved plan. The Norwalk Community School will provide all participating schools with full disclosures of funds expended, copies of all minutes of meetings and all official reports. Any consorting district wishing to dissolve their association will be required to return all consortium property to the consortium upon termination of agreement with the property to be in good condition according to the anticipated useful life of the property.

Termination of this agreement will be by formal written notice with the signature of the executive officer of the district withdrawing.

The terms of this contract are for three years commencing on July 1, 1991 and terminating on June 30, 1994 provided, however, that the terms of this agreement are contingent upon the approval of the Iowa Department of Education.

This agreement shall be in force upon filing with the secretary of state and the county recorder.
